Bulk Trash

Our garbage carters will take most items as bulk trash on the curb, but if you are in doubt, please call Village Hall at 354-0545 to ask us. White goods such as refrigerators, dish washers, hot water heaters, stoves, etc. can be picked up but you have to make arrangements for them ahead of time by calling Waste Management at 753-6882. There is a small fee involved for these items. Home construction debris such as tiling, wall board, 2 x 4's, sheet rock, cabinets, wall-to-wall carpeting, etc. also have to be pre-arranged.

Certain items cannot be collected by our carter at all—they are for example, cans with paint, pesticides, chemicals and any other hazardous waste, but you can take them to the Hazardous Waste Facility just outside the village. It is located at the Firemen's Training Center off Pomona Road (at the Route 45 end). Again, if you are not sure, just call us at 354-0545 or call the Hazardous Waste Facility at 364-2444 and to find out when they are open.

Bulk trash needs to be placed at the curb, and all bulk, garbage and recycling must always be out by 6:15 a.m. on the day of collection.




The Pomona Cultural Center Summer 2006 Programs
