

Mayor's Corner



In our last workshop meeting on June 11th, the members of the board were given their Official Areas of Responsibility. It may come as a surprise to many village residents that the Mayor and Trustees take a very active role in the actual workings of the village. We do not

have a large staff to handle all of the day-to-day operations of the village, so the trustees are all assigned areas of responsibility. Ian Banks, as well as being Deputy Mayor, oversees village maintenance, parks and landscaping, and storm water management. Alma Roman is our Ethics Committee chair, and also is assigned to outreach, environmental concerns (with Brett Yagel) and is liaison to the Rockland County Commission on Human Rights. Rita Louie is board liaison to the planning board, ZBA and schools, oversees the cultural center, and will handle public relations and village beautification. Brett Yagel was formally appointed board liaison to the Fire and Emergency services (a new position), and will also be responsible for office operations and technology. He will also work on grant acquisition, and will oversee recreation. So you can see that being a trustee in our village is not just attending two meetings a month!

I am very pleased to be able to report that the Haverstraw highway department has started working on the berms that were broken during the winter. Perhaps by the time you read this, they will all have been repaired, as I was promised! There was a lot of berm damage last winter, and we will be looking into ways of reducing this costly maintenance item, perhaps by marking the more frequently damaged areas (as several residents have recommended).

There have recently been a series of resident complaints on two subjects somewhat related to each other. Several residents have called, emailed or written village hall complaining that grass has been allowed to grow uncut on several properties in the village. The village does not have a local law that regulates cutting of grass and weeds on residents' properties. However, there is a section of the state building code that regulates this on the basis of environmental concerns. This regulation limits grass and weeds to a height of ten inches. Village policy has been to make residents aware of this regulation when a complaint has been filed, or the code enforcement officer has noticed a violation. The other set of complaints recently has to do with seemingly abandoned property. This is a potential safety issue, and the village does have a regulation in the code that covers unsafe buildings (Ch 50). On receiving a number of complaints recently, I reviewed Chapter 50 with Doris Ulman, our village attorney, and we came to the conclusion that this section of the code is out of date, and needs a revision. So a local law has been drafted to modify Ch 50 to make it more enforceable, and a public hearing has been scheduled for the June village board meeting.

Finally, I am looking forward to seeing a great number of village residents at our Fish-In on July 8th, and our first Village Music Festival at Village Hall on July 14th.



Recreation Committee - now forming!


