
Help us help them!

BULK TRASH PICKUP

Most residents don't realize that if you have bulk trash to be picked up, you actually have 2 days each week that you can put it on the curb. Any day you have garbage pick-up, you also have bulk trash pick-up. So if you have your garbage collected on Monday and Thursday, you may also put the bulk trash out on Monday and Thursday. If you have garbage pick-up on Tuesday and Friday, you may

also put the bulk trash out on Tuesday and Friday. Only difference is that bulk trash must be on the curb whereas garbage can be picked up at the house. If you have any questions as to what can be bulk trash, please call Leslie at Village Hall at 354-0545. We can take most

anything with a few exceptions: white goods (stoves, refrigerators, water heaters and the like) can be picked up, but there is a small fee involved. Also, home construction debris like flooring, wallboard, plywood, etc. can also be collected but there is a small fee involved with those items too.

The Pomona Post Office on Route 202 is now open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. Also, Saturday from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Just in time for the holidays!

Just a reminder, please be aware that there is no overnight parking in the Village at any time and from November 15th through April 1st, because of potential snow removal operations, parking on Village roads is prohibited between 12 Midnight and 6:00 AM.
