VILLAGE CODES

For those of you who are new to the Village, you may not realize that there are various rules that must be adhered to if you are planning on doing certain things to your property. One of those that comes up frequently is “**what are the rules for cutting down trees on your own property**”?

The rules for cutting down trees on your own property are different from the rules at a builder/developer has to follow. The Village Code, Chapter 130, regulates the cutting of trees on resident’s property, based on number of trees to be cut, size and whether the tree is a “Protected Tree.” The relevant sections of the code are shown below:

From Ch 130-18 (H) (7)

(7) A permit to clear, fill or grade property shall not be required for the planting of landscaping, grading low areas with a total of 15 or fewer cubic yards of fill material, correcting hazards representing an imminent threat to life or property, removal of dead trees, harvesting of firewood not to exceed four live trees per year 25 inches in circumference or more measured at a height 4 1/2 feet above existing ground level at the base of the tree on the uphill side, or for land development pursuant to but not proper to the issuance of a building permit, an approved and filed subdivision plat for an approved site plan. A protected tree, as defined in this chapter, shall be preserved unless such tree endangers the health or safety of any person or interferes with the use or construction of any structure on the lot or is a dead tree as determined by a landscape architect or similar professional. An application for a building permit to remove a protected tree shall include a revegetation or replacement plan for replacement of the tree to be removed. Replacement may be proposed in another location on the same lot and is not required to be of the same species or size of the tree to be removed. [Amended 11-25-2003 by L.L. 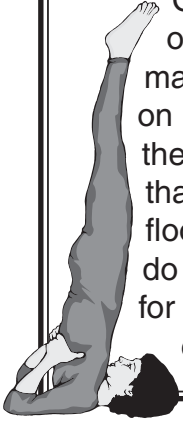
From Ch 130-4 - Definition of terms

PROTECTED TREE - Any tree of historical value as determined by resolution of the Board of Trustees or any tree having a circumference of 45 inches or more measured at a height 4 - _ feet above existing ground level at the base of the tree on the uphill side.

[Added 3-28-2005 by L.L. No. 2-2005]

In synopsis, a resident may cut down any number of trees less than 25” circumference, and a maximum of 4 per year of trees larger than 25”. A building permit is required to take down a protected tree, or a larger number than allowed by the code.
